The Self-Assessment score should be based on objectively verifiable records and shall be finalized by the screening-cum-evaluation committee for the promotion of Asst. Professor to higher grades and selection committee for the promotion of Asst. Professor to Associate Professor and Associate Professor to Professor and for direct recruitment of Associate Professor and Professor.

The model table below gives groups of activities and API scores. Universities may detail the activities or, in case, institutional specificities require, adjust the weightages without changing the minimum total API score required under this category.
